Timeline

All Pathways have a timeline of 16 weeks. Students will take an assessment at the end of the instructional semester for specific certifications.



Certifications

Certifications earned are nationally recognized and crucial for gainful employment



Workplace

Many Pathways have opportunities for on the job experience. The last two weeks students work on preparing for the workforce by creating resumes and practicing interviewing skills.

Certified Nursing Assistant



Program Description:

The C.N.A./Home Health Aid Program is a 16 week classroom and internship experience that will prepare you to be successful for the Certified Nursing Assistant state licensure. There are 14 weeks of classroom instruction and a clinical experience, and a two week test-preparation and testing period.

Training and Experience:

Clients will have experiences in the classroom and C.N.A. Lab along with an internship experience at a local nursing home. Students are required to have a TB test and other required vaccinations.

Certifications:

Certifications may be earned in CPR/First Aid; C.N.A. Licensure; and Home Health Care.

Career Outcomes:

The Certified Nursing Assistant Program prepares students to test for their state C.N.A. licensure. Students attaining licensure can work in nursing homes, rehabilitation centers, hospitals, clinics, and other places that provide medical services. Some careers in the Home Health field include private home health care or working for a Home Health provider.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the C.N.A./Home Health Aid Program must have:

- A 4th grade reading level or above
- The ability to lift 40- 50 pounds.

CVS / Retail



Program Description:

The CVS/Retail Program is a 16 week program with classroom instruction and an internship at a community CVS Store. Additional retail certifications are offered in this program.

Training and Experience:

Clients will have classroom training, stackable certification opportunities, and hands-on training at the community CVS Store. Other internships may be available.

Certifications:

Certifications may be earned in NRF (National Retail Foundation) Rise up – Retail Industry Fundamentals; Business of Retail; Customer Service and Sales; and/or Warehouse, Inventory Logistics.



Careers Outcomes:

Clients completing the CVS/Retail Program are prepared for careers in this field such as cashier; stock clerk; unloader; inventory clerk; sales associate; customer service representative; loss prevention officer; visual merchandiser; and team lead/management.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the CVS/Retail Program must have:

- A 3rd grade reading level or above; or
- Approval of the Instructor

Auto Detailing



Program Description:

The Auto Detailing Program is a 16 week program that prepares clients to pursue careers in auto detailing. Additionally, the program includes instruction on self-employment opportunities as an auto detailer. The program includes classroom activities for certifications, extensive hands-on training, and virtual training in auto painting.

Training and Experience:

Enrolled clients will participate in hands-on training to learn best practices for auto detailing and safety requirements. They will also learn how to physically inspect a car for damage, check fluids and oil, and determine tread depth on tires.

Certifications:

Enrolled clients can earn industry recognized certifications through the International Detail Association.

Career Outcomes:

The Auto Detailing Program prepares clients for self-employment as an auto detailer or a job with an established auto detailing company. A graduate of the program may also pursue a career at a body shop, car dealership, car/equipment rental business, or car wash.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the Auto Detailing Program must have:

- a 3rd grade reading level or above; and,
- the ability to physically clean automobiles.

Hospitality



Program Description:

The Hospitality Program is a new and exciting program that offers stackable certifications in the hospitality industry. The program is 16 weeks in length and the course curriculum is tailored to each specific job certification.

Training and Experience:

Enrolled clients will be taught using a wide variety of modalities through in-person discussion and instruction, on-line instruction, a Learning Lab set up like each certification area, and real -life experiences both on our campus and in our local community. Clients will be fully prepared for a job in this industry.

Certifications:

Certifications earned through AHLEI (American Hotel and Lodging Educational Institute) and include: Guest Room Attendant; Restaurant Server; Kitchen Cook; Breakfast Attendant; Front Desk Receptionist; Maintenance Employee. Guest Service Tourism Certification will also be offered.

Career Outcomes:

The Hospitality Program prepares clients for a variety of careers in the Hospitality industry and there are opportunities across our state. Some careers are Hotel Desk Clerk or Receptionist; Hotel Room Attendant / Housekeeper; Restaurant Server; Maintenance Worker for hotels, apartments, and condominiums; Breakfast Attendant, Cafeteria Worker; Hospital Food Service; and a Cook or Food Service Worker.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the Hospitality Program must have:

- A 4th grade reading level or above; and
- The ability to perform tasks associated with each certification training

Forklift and Warehouse



Program Description:

The Logistics-Forklift and Warehouse Program is a 16 week program that prepares clients for skills needed in the supply chain industry as well as learning to safely operate a forklift and other warehousing equipment.

Training and Experience:

Clients will have experiences in the RWS Warehouse and in the Griffin BEP Warehouse where a variety of equipment and methods of warehousing and material handling will be learned. There will also be classroom instruction that includes simulator training and opportunities for earning certifications.

Certifications:

Enrolled clients may earn certifications in OSHA-10; MSSC (Manufacturing Skills Standards Council); and Forklift Operation.

Career Outcomes:

Clients to be trained for careers in this field that include material handler; forklift operator; stock clerk; order picker; shipping and receiving clerk; warehouse laborer; loader/unloader; and package handler. This is a growing industry in the state of Georgia with many job opportunities.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the Distribution & Logistics Program must have:

- A 4th grade Reading Level
- The ability to lift 30-50 pounds

Low Voltage Wiring



Program Description:

Low Voltage Wiring is a 16 week program that is a component of construction but moves into the installation of cable; internet; audio-visual systems; outdoor lighting; and security systems.

Training and Experience:

Clients will have both classroom and hands-on building and wiring experiences. Classroom instruction will include opportunities for earning several industry- recognized certifications. Students learn some aspects of high voltage electricity and construction as well.

Certifications:

Clients may earn certifications in OSHA-10; RESI (Residential Electronics Systems Integrator); CEDIA (Custom Electronics Design and Installation Association); and CPR/First Aid.

Career Outcomes:

Clients completing the Low Voltage wiring program are prepared for a variety of careers in this field that includes employment with cable and internet providers; phone companies; outdoor lighting contractors; and security system providers. There are also career opportunities to install audio-visual equipment and sound systems.

Program Criteria:

Clients participating in the Low Voltage Wiring Program must have:

- An 8th grade reading level or above; and,
- The ability to lift at least 50 pounds.

Already a VR Client?

Contact your VR Counselor or reach out to RWS directly: rws.csc.referrals@gvs.ga.gov to receive an application and info on criteria

Admission decision made within 10 days of receiving application and required supporting documents

Clients will be notified directly by RWS staff of admissions status

If accepted, admissions packet will be on way

If not, referral to VR counselor for additional supports

Not a VR Client?

RWS staff will work with applicant to determine eligibility for VR services and a 10 day determination if they meet RWS criteria

If eligible for VR services and meets RWS criteria, a counselor will notify the client and work with them to develop an IPE

If not eligible, they will be notified by RWS staff and case will be transferred to local field office to develop an optional plan for supports
